This course is designed to provide information and hands on training to students/team members who may need to respond to surface ice calls. ## **Level 1 Student Prerequisites**

1. 18 years old
2. Should be a member of a Emergency First Response group
3. Must be a good swimmer, in good health and comfortable working in the water
4. CPR / AED / O2 / First Aid certified

## **Qualifications of Graduates**

Awareness, Operational and Technician Level courses are for emergency response personnel who may be first on the scene of a swift water emergency. First responders at the awareness level are expected to recognize the presence of hazardous conditions, protect themselves, secure the area, and call for additional resources, activate an emergency plan, assess conditions and attempt a reach or throw rescue, or contact rescue.

**\*\*This is an extremely physically demanding course and potential for injury always exist students must be in excellent physical condition and be competent swimmers. All participants will be required to have an adequate health insurance, sign waivers and provide emergency contact.**
